
The Challenge

- Impact their school and community



Component 2 – Coordinates with a community agency, another school, a business, or the community at large	4 points
Component 3 – Helps foster civic responsibility	4 points
Component 4 – Impact on the school or community	4 points
Component 5 – Provides a plan for sustainability	4 points
Component 6 – Displays proficiency in public speaking, addressing the <i>Writing and Speaking & Listening Anchor standards</i>	4 points
TOTAL POSSIBLE	24 points

Grants

<u>Overall</u>	For the project that demonstrates excellence in all six Components	\$2,500
<u>Meet the Need</u>	For the project that best identifies and meets a school or community need	\$1,000
<u>Community Collaboration</u>	For the project that best coordinates with school and community partners	\$1,000
<u>Impact</u>	For the project that has the most significant impact on the school, community, and Team members	\$1,000
<u>Sustainability</u>	For the project that will either be sustained long-term in the original school, or can be easily replicated in other schools and communities	\$1,000


Grant funding awarded to winning schools is intended to be used on materials, supplies, and/or activities directly related to students. The grant monies may not be used on field trips.
